

Global donor nutrition-specific disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets in 2015

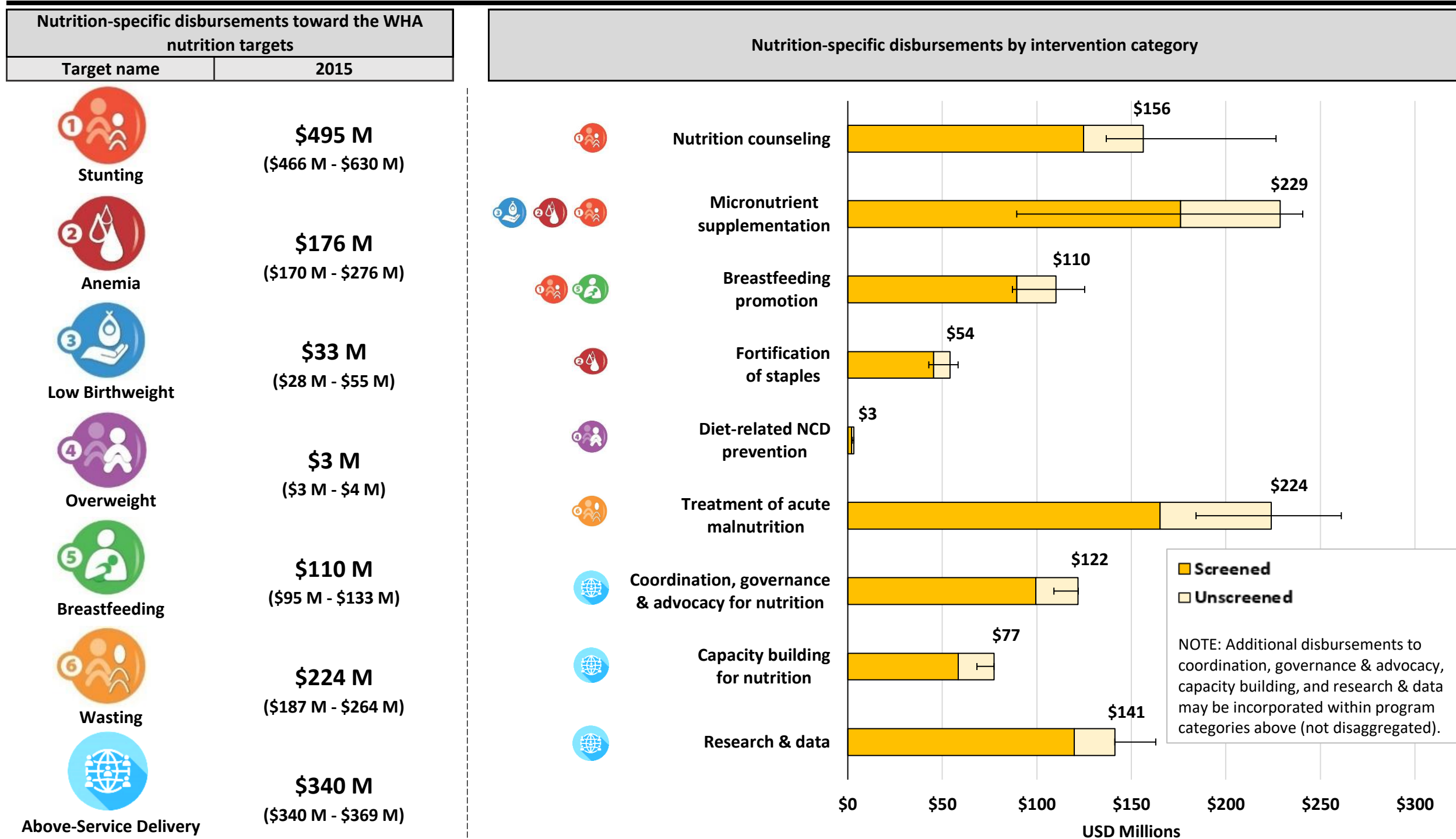
\$1.12 billion \pm **\$413 million**
 (\$1.00 B - \$1.17 B) was spent in 2015 on the WHA targets
 (\$401 M - \$421 M) was spent in 2015 on other basic nutrition interventions

- 70% of country-level WHA disbursements went to 37 highest stunting burden countries
- 73% of donor disbursements shown went to the priority package of interventions
- \$1.91 per child under 5 was disbursed by donors to contribute to the WHA nutrition targets
- \$6.86 per stunted child under 5 was disbursed by donors to contribute to the WHA nutrition targets

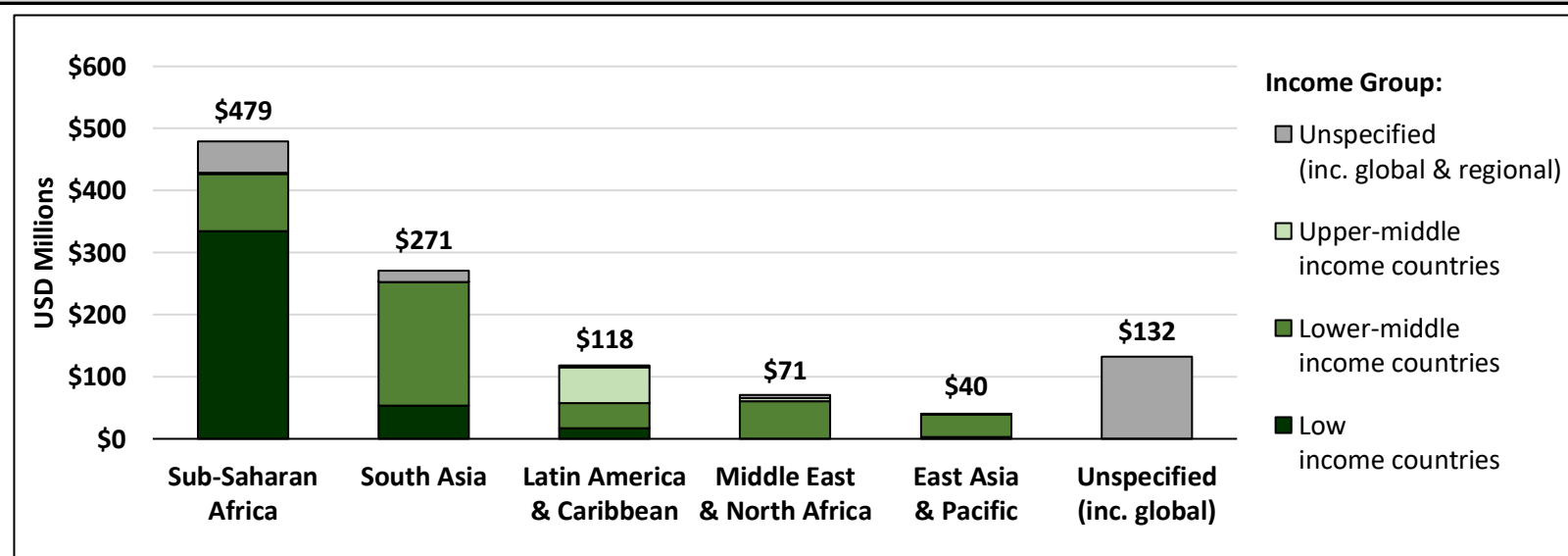
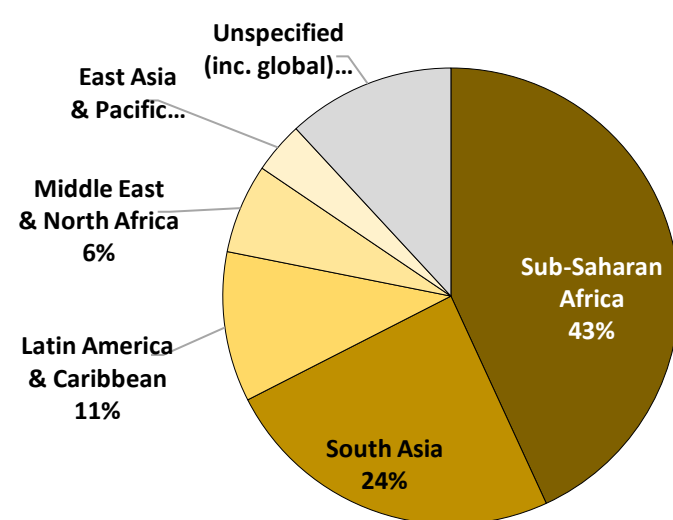

NOTE: This summary reports 2015 nutrition-specific donor disbursements aligned with the WHA nutrition targets, as defined by the Global Investment Framework for Nutrition (Shekar et al., 2017). While investments in the enabling environment and nutrition-sensitive activities are critical to achieve the WHA targets, disbursement data is currently unavailable. Disbursements across the WHA targets cannot be summed due to intervention overlap.

Data represents disbursements to all low-income, lower-middle-income, and upper-middle-income recipient countries as well as regional and global disbursements unallocated by country. All figures represent gross disbursements and are in constant prices (2015) in USD millions unless otherwise stated. 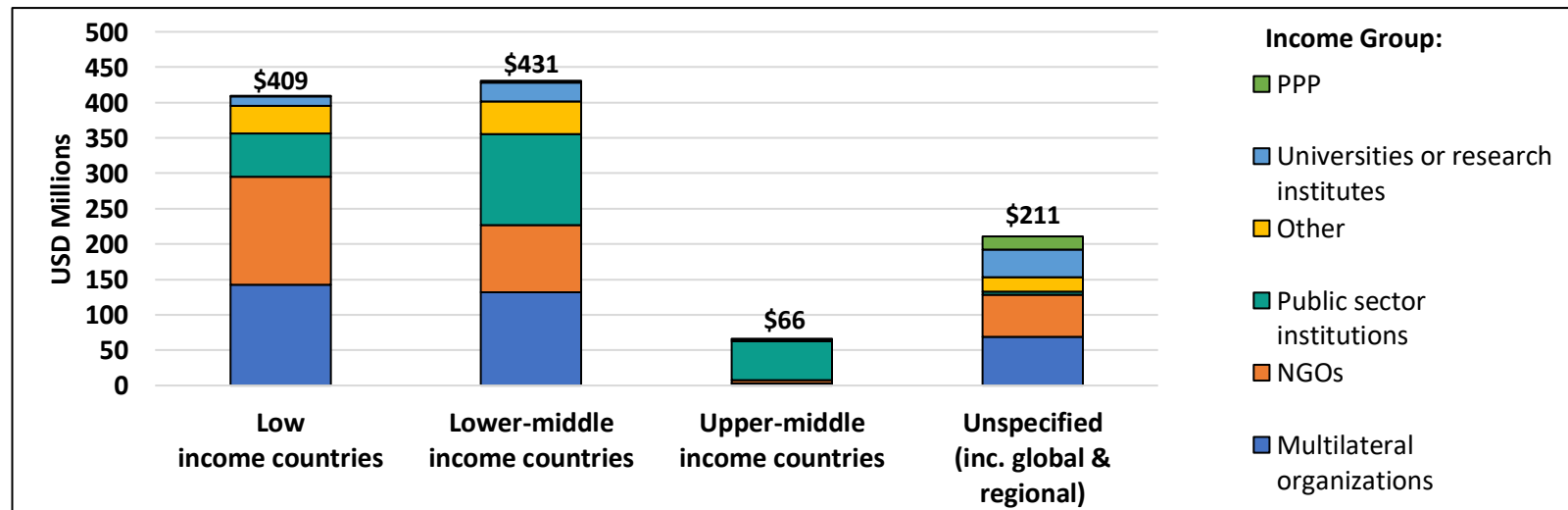
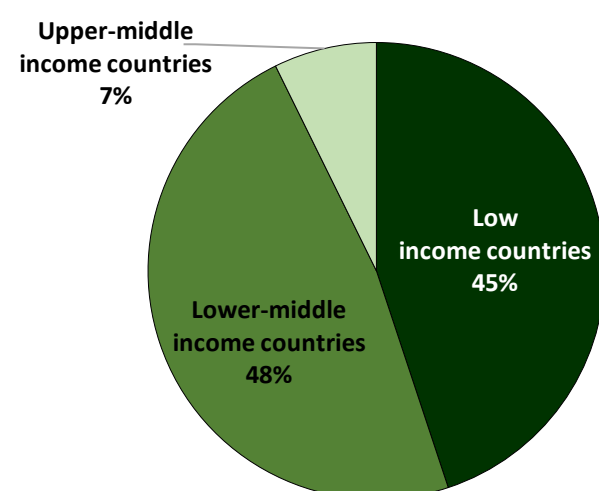


Nutrition-specific disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets by recipient region in 2015



For readability, Europe/Central Asia region and North America region were excluded from this figure. Europe/Central Asia received \$5 M and North America received \$1 M in WHA target disbursements in 2015.

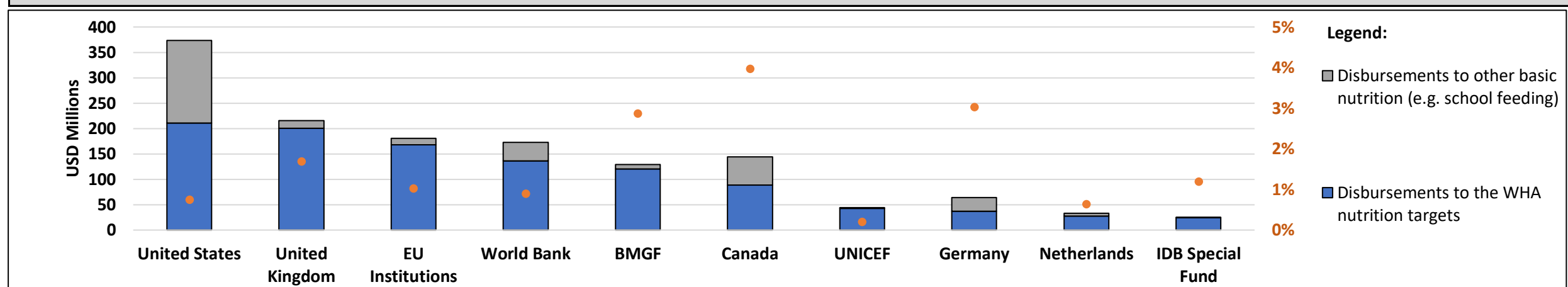
Nutrition-specific disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets by recipient income group and channel in 2015



This Figure shows the breakdown by income group for disbursements going to recipient countries only. It excludes regional and global disbursements in order to present a more accurate average breakdown by income group for any given country-level disbursement.

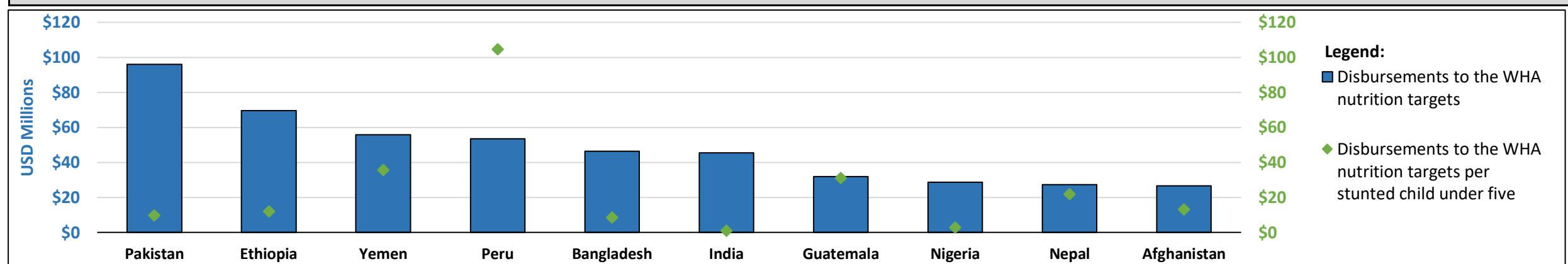
Channels are defined by the CRS, as reported by donors. NGOs = non-governmental organizations; PPPs = public-private partnerships. NGOs includes local and donor-country-based NGOs.

Top 10 donors who made nutrition-specific disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets in 2015



These top 10 donors contributed 92% of all disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets in 2015 and 91% of total nutrition disbursements (WHA disbursements plus other basic nutrition disbursements). World Bank includes IDA and IBRD disbursements (61% and 39% of the WHA-adjusted total shown, respectively), which are reported separately in the CRS. Differences between these OECD data (based on World Bank reporting) and data published by the World Bank for economic sectors and themes (i.e., purpose of activities), are due to the use of different classification systems. For the multilateral organizations shown (EU institutions, World Bank, UNICEF), dollar values represent core disbursements only.

Top 10 recipient countries that received nutrition-specific funding for the WHA nutrition targets in 2015



Top 10 countries of 127 total recipient countries receiving global nutrition aid for the WHA nutrition targets in 2015. These top 10 countries received 43% of all disbursements to the WHA nutrition targets in 2015. Figure excludes the following categories that are among the top ten recipients that are not countries: "bilateral, unspecified" (\$132m - rank 1) and "South of Sahara, regional" (\$38m - rank 8); Contributions to all remaining recipients totaled \$636 M in 2015.

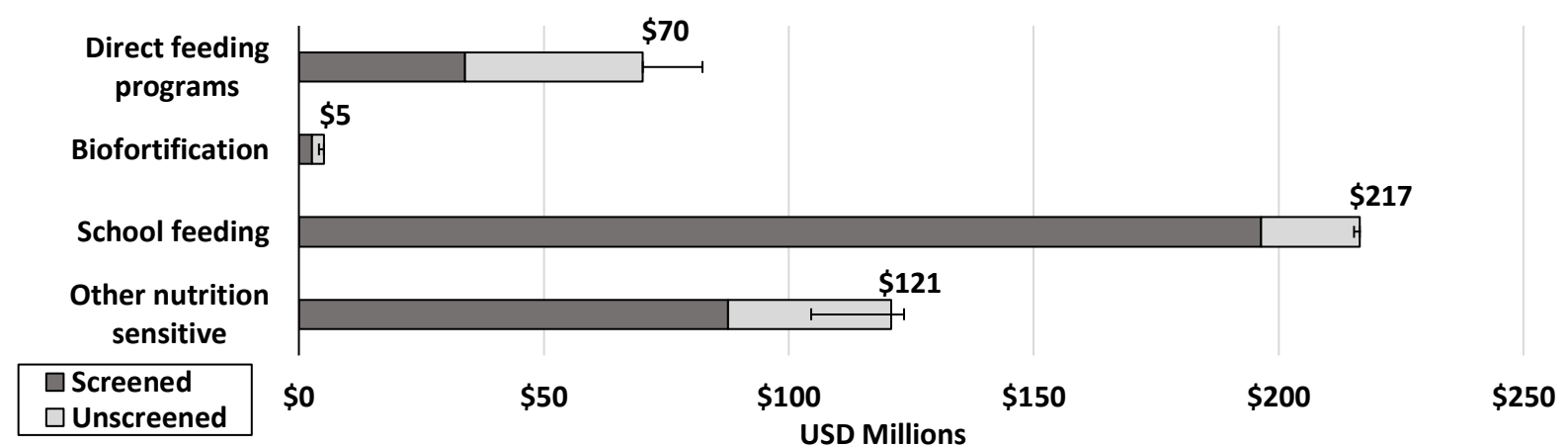

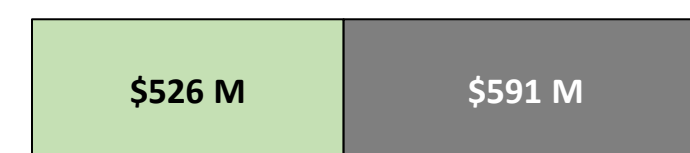

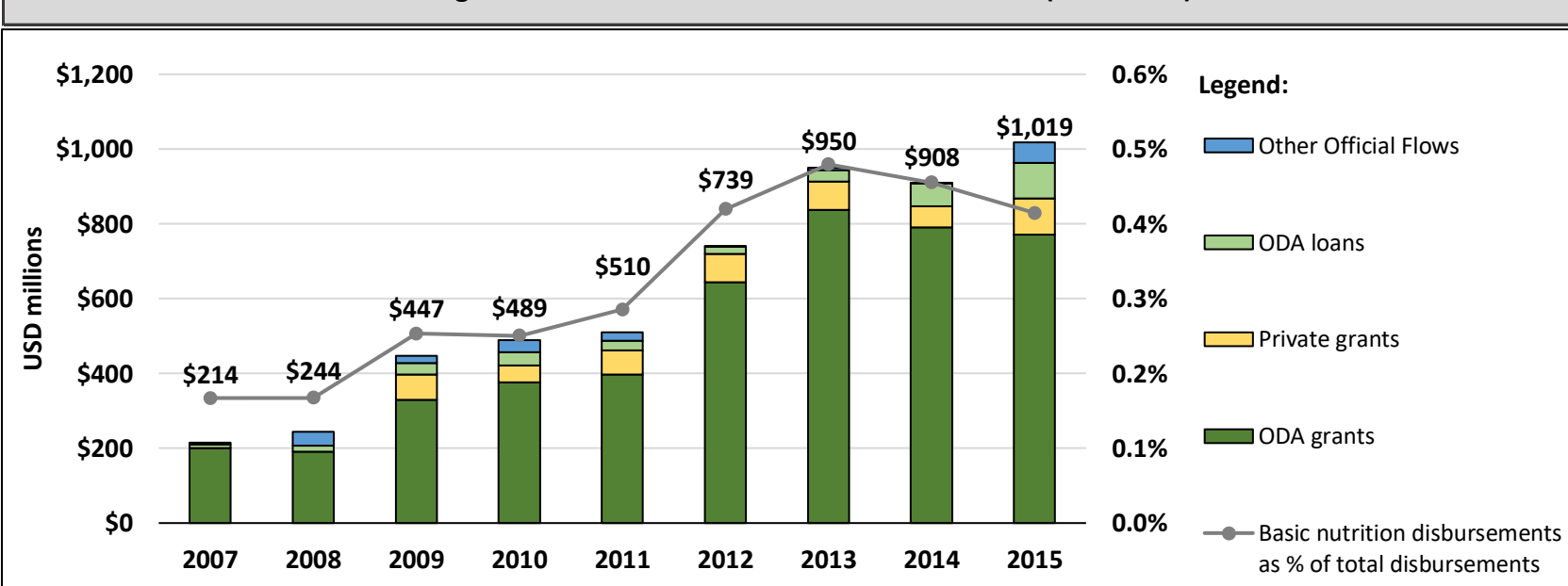
Nutrition projects flagged with the OECD gender marker
